Recap and Reflections by Nate Guyton

Tracing Ripples Forward: Reflections on the SFBTA's Final Town Hall of 2025

In a tone more like a gathering around a familiar fire than a broadcasted event, the Solution-Focused Brief Therapy Association held its final town hall of the year—an intentional offering of shared presence. What emerged was a confluence of organizational updates, narrative momentum, and an evocative training by Dr. Linda Metcalf that reminded us that change, like language, is co-authored in real time.

A Community in Motion: Organizational Updates

The board's report resembled a year of growth with a redesigned website as its new front cover. Easier navigation now leads users into curated research, archived board meetings, and a living directory of global solution-focused conversations. Members were encouraged not just to consume the content but to participate in its becoming: submitting listings, reporting glitches, and seeding the new monthly newsletter with book reviews, practice briefs, and community announcements. And then, with a subtle shift in gear, the conversation turned toward the horizon—Toronto, November 6–9, 2025—the next annual conference already taking shape. With 61 registrants, 63 speakers, and 46 workshops (organized across five themes), the event promises to be both intimate and expansive. A keynote by Jennifer Gerwing will anchor the weekend, alongside presentations from Becky Taylor, Dina Bednar, Shima Husen, and many others. Sponsorships remain open. Nominations for next year's board, too, are encouraged—submitted directly through the website. Meanwhile, bids for the 2026 conference location are still being accepted, and participants were reminded to review the bylaws ahead of November's members meeting.


Anchoring Change in Language: Dr. Linda Metcalf's Training

If the meeting had a gravitational center, it was Linda Metcalf's training on solution-focused school counseling: a thoughtful, field-tested synthesis of narrative reframing and systemic thinking. Speaking with the grounded authority of a longtime educator and counselor, Linda offered not only techniques but a philosophy rooted in hope and in the belief that language is both the map and the territory. She approached classroom struggles—bullying, disruptions, even gang involvement—not as fixed problems but as stories awaiting a shift in plot. At the heart of her approach stood the miracle question, a deceptively simple prompt that unlocks preferred futures and reveals agency where it was previously obscured. Teachers and parents (often treated as side characters in educational crises) were reimagined as vital co-authors, their language and presence shaping the emotional climate of the classroom. One anecdote stood out: a mother, previously labeled a "helicopter parent," whose hovering dissolved once her child's strengths came into focus. The problem didn't disappear, it was redescribed. Through this lens, behavior is not pathology, but communication; and change begins with how we listen. Participants were invited to rethink the language they use to describe students and systems. Reframing labels, identifying exceptions, and amplifying small moments of success—these practices, Linda noted, are not add-ons to the work; they are the work. Even logistical acts, like walking a student back to class after a session, become rituals of reconnection. Scaling tools, such as rating classroom climate or student mood, become conversational doorways into potential. She shared practical

strategies: using music to ease transitions, offering noise-canceling headphones as tools for regulation, and creating space for students to "reset" rather than retreat. One particularly moving story featured a teacher whose student helped her improve classroom participation through the very tools Linda taught—scaling, reflection, and attentive listening. In this story, the student became the spark of transformation, and the teacher became the learner. The loop closed, not with a solution, but with a relationship.

Sustaining the Work: Looking Beyond the Town Hall

As Linda's session came to a close, participants were reminded of her ongoing contributions—SF Connection webinars, weekly educator tips, and her upcoming presentation with Marcella at the 7th Solution Books Conference. The invitation was clear: stay connected, try something new, share what works. The board concluded with a series of open doors—calls for contributions to the newsletter, reminders about committee involvement (particularly Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion), and gentle encouragement to shape the community not just as members, but as stewards of its future. What resonated most, perhaps, was not a single announcement or technique but the atmosphere: one of relational momentum. If solution-focused work reminds us that people are not their problems, this meeting reminded us that organizations, too, are not their structures—they are their conversations.

Johnny S. Kim, Ph.D., LCSW, is a professor at the University of Denver Graduate School of Social Work. Dr. Kim received his Master's degree in social work from Boston College, Ph.D. in social work from the University of Texas at Austin, and was a Council on Social Work Education Minority Clinical Fellow. His teaching areas include clinical social work theory and practice, solution-focused brief therapy, and school social work. Dr. Kim's research focuses on evaluating solution-focused brief therapy, school-based interventions, meta-analysis and evidence-based practice. He has published over 50 articles in peer reviewed journals, book chapters and books. Dr. Kim is a member of the Research Committee for the Solution-Focused Brief Therapy Association and serves on the editorial board for several journals. Prior to his doctoral studies, Dr. Kim worked as a school social worker and case manager for community-based mental health agencies in Seattle.
