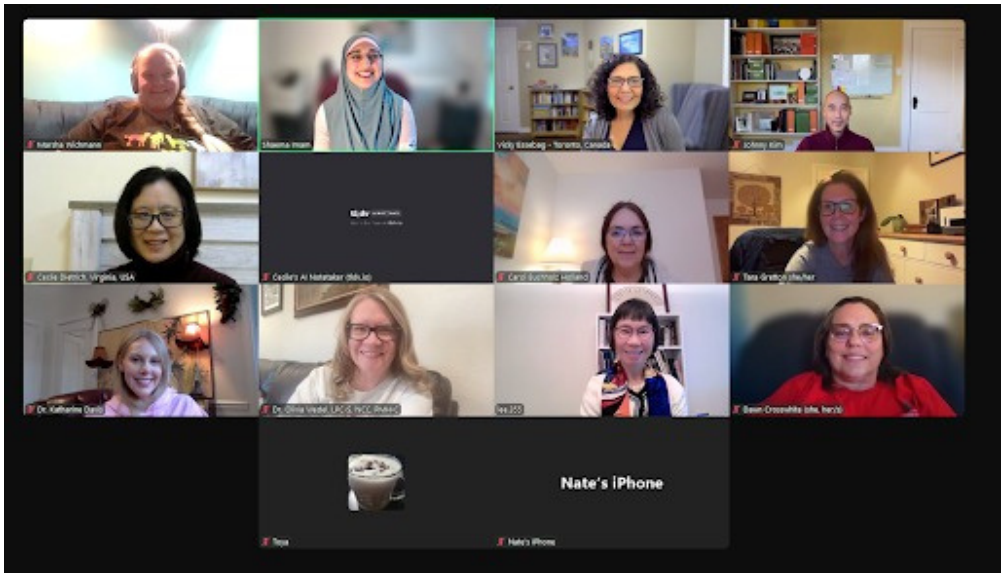

I hope you will **save the date: November 5–8, 2026**, hosted at **Cleveland State University in Cleveland, Ohio.**



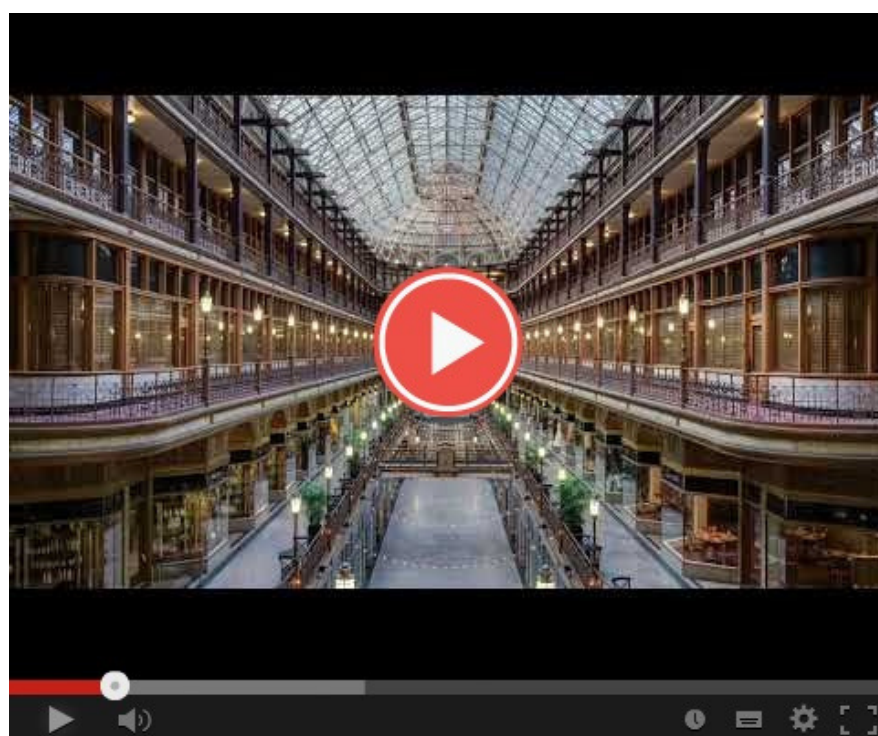

A look back at 2025 Committees: Work done and best hopes going forward

Advisory Council (President's Portfolio)



Though this is a new “official” committee per Bylaw amendments made at the Annual Members’ Meeting in November 2025, this year, Shaema was able to get informal advice from past presidents of SFBTA and past board members going back to the origins of SFBTA almost 25 years ago. Going forward, the President will have the official help of the immediate-past-president on this committee if desired, as well as the ability to seek advice as she sees fit from previous board members so that she may learn from our resourceful past to innovate into our preferred future!

Membership Committee



This is a new committee to support the bylaw-mandated membership coordinator role. In 2025, membership was increased from about 120 in January to 208 members by December. Also, a “frequently asked questions” list was developed for the website as well as a welcome letter for all new members.

Finance Committee



In 2025, Treasurer Dawn Crosswhite managed this role on her own without a committee to assist. The 2025 budget stayed relatively balanced (slightly positive) from start to finish, with income from the conference, membership fees, and donations, balancing out the research award, support for JFSP, and some board expenses (board insurance, and expenses and subscription fees for online profiles).

Conference Committee



Conference Co-chairs Vicky Essebag and Haesun Moon managed a successful 2025 Conference with strong attendance achieved from points outside of the host city as well as from locals, costs remained as predicted, and the diversity of topics and presenters was appreciated. A 2026 conference site was identified (Cleveland) after a review and bids exploration from 5 different sites. 2026 Conference chair Michelle Lasky was able to secure her alma mater for a conference host, Cleveland State University. Research Committee

In 2025, the latest update to the Treatment Manual was completed and published on the sfbta.org website for public viewing and access free of charge. The 2025 Research Award was disbursed and information about past winners was updated on the website.

Outreach Committee



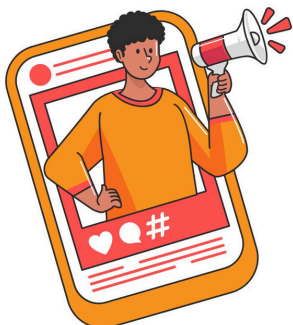
The Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Committee was renamed as the Outreach Committee to reflect its action-oriented approach to invite underrepresented groups to the table. Several organizations were invited to collaborate with the SFBTA and networking is ongoing. Committee members are diverse as well, with representation from 5 different countries around the world (UAE, Canada, USA, India, and Zimbabwe).

Professional Development Committee



In 2025, this committee met for several monthly meetings to develop brainstorming ideas into practicable events going into 2026. Ideas for a mentorship program were developed, the established twice yearly trainings were reconfirmed (with successful events in April and August), and lists of free online training were compiled. Other potential training formats were also discussed, including case conferences, skill development workshops, and specialty/affinity focus groups.

Member Communications Committee



There was much growth in this committee during 2025! The website was reinvented with much more content and resources onboard. This newsletter was re-established after about two decades of pause. An active online presence was maintained on LinkedIn, Facebook, and Instagram, and a new YouTube Channel was established. At the Annual Members' Meeting, a motion was made to formally thank and recognize Cyan Verzosa, our professional website designer and online content manager, for her extensive contributions to SFBTA communications. This motion was proposed by Shaema Imam, seconded by

SFBTA Member Catherine, and adopted unanimously by the entire membership. Thank you Cyan!

Archives Committee

Several meetings were held over the second half of 2025 to formulate what a documentary on the early development of SFBT with a specific focus on interviewing those who knew Insoo Kim Berg and Steve de Shazer would look like. The upcoming 25th anniversary (2027) of SFBTA’s formulation was also noted, with plans to have a retrospective video interviewing those involved from the earliest days. Though filming has not yet started, potential interviewees have been listed and invitations to participate are being sent.

Board Development Committee



This committee was “officially” formulated by majority vote through bylaw amendments in November 2025. However, this year, an informal meeting was held with a representative of Solution Focus in Organizations (SFIO) executive Annie Bordeleau to discuss collaboration so that SFBTA may be not only “about” SF, but run in an “SF” manner. Transition protocols were also formulated so that SFBTA’s institutional knowledge and lessons learned may transfer smoothly from one board to the next. Bylaw Amendments are also within the purview of this committee, and this year, 31 amendments were made by majority vote to ensure that the bylaws reflected current realities of online participation, and delineated the roles of standing committees and members. SF EVENT REPORT

Online Training for North Dakota Counseling Association

Francesca presented More of what works— A Solution Focused Approach to Supervision for the North Dakota Counseling Association’s monthly webinar series in December. (Her biggest take away— there was an attendee who had never heard of solution focus!)

SFBTA member, Francesca Garza-Fraire, presented More of What Works— A Solution Focused Approach to Supervision for the North Dakota Counseling Association’s monthly webinar series on December 12, 2025. Attendees across North Dakota participated in the Moan, moan, moan Activity and SF Silent Supervision in which Francesca adapted a lesson on Silent Sessions presented by Family Based Solutions at the SFBTA Conference in November by Ayse Adil. This adaptation has created a way for large, supervised groups to reflect and ask focused questions for feedback, and Francesca couldn’t wait to share the tool with her colleagues in North Dakota.

Francesca is the Program Director for School Counseling at the University of Mary in Bismarck, North Dakota. Since 2023, she has been introducing Solution Focus to her graduate counseling students who are specializing in both clinical mental health and school counseling. SF became a valuable resource to UMary in 2023 when the university was awarded a 6.2 million dollar grant for the recruitment, education, and licensure of school counseling students in high needs, rural, and tribal communities by the department of education. This grant created immediate positions in school for novice counseling students. With the current demands in schools, counseling students asked for support and resources they could use right away. The MHSP grant funded supplemental training in SF for the counseling students and set them up with language and a helping stance that has begun to empower and support the students and the school communities in their care.

Dr. Garza-Fraire’s most exciting moment from the NDCA webinar was one attendee who stated she had never heard of Solution Focus. Francesca has learned the value of SF in practice and in counselor education and finds great joy in sharing a practice that empowers clients, creates sustainability for the helper, and facilitates curious respect.
